This fall, City and Port officials are bringing to the public the results of extensive work during the past year, including reports detailing environmental impacts of waterfront redevelopment and options that will contribute to a final master plan.

City and Port officials are in agreement about most items, such as balancing economic, environmental and social values, developing at least 33 acres of public parks and trails, adopting mixed-use zoning, and creating opportunities to host higher education institutions and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

City and Port officials are still considering options for street alignment, connections to downtown, preserving historic buildings, and infrastructure costs and timing, and have presented plans to the community that offer options for the public to consider.
